the Conference "Common Goals and Ideals: 40 Years of Cooperation between Portugal and China Retrospect and Prospect", held on 21st and 22nd May 2919, respectively at the Rectory of the University of Lisbon and at ISEG, was jointly organized by NSRF with Confucius Institute of the Lisbon University, ISEG - Lisbon School of Economics and Management and the Diplomatic Institute of the Portuguese Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In this conference, the 40 years of diplomatic relations between Portugal and the People's Republic of China were dynamically analyzed, projecting them for the future, namely prospecting the economic cooperation of Portugal and China in the New Maritime Silk Road of the 21st Century.

Distinguished guest speakers connected with Portugal-China relations, such as the former Foreign Minister Paulo Portas and the Minister of the Sea Ana Paula Vitorino gave their views on the prospected cooperation. The Italian government will attend a summit of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) in Beijing - just a month after becoming the first G7 country to join the strategy and sign various trade and infrastructure agreements with the China.

Opportunities and challenges for BRI in Europe

Although lagging other countries, Italy is playing a lead role in the China-proposed Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), the first G7 nation to have signed a memorandum of understanding on cooperation within the BRI framework.

For Italy, the Chinese market remains a strategic target. Current Italy exports to China about 13 billion euros (\$ 14.6 billion). Italy also aims to seize the opportunities that will emerge in other countries involved in the BRI, implementing know-how in Africa and the Balkans by means of trilateral cooperation.

According to estimates, the BRI could increase global trade of the EU by up to 6 percent, and of Italy by up to 7 percent. This is particularly the case if trans-Eurasian rail corridors are further modernized (container transportation). Fully fledged participation in the BRI (if salient connectivity projects are completed) may contribute to overcoming the region's traditionally peripheral economic position in Europe.

East African ports linked to the Chinese BRI

The ports of Mozambique, Angola and São Tomé and Príncipe will be linked to the Chinese "Belt and Road" initiative, which will have a "central node" in East Africa, attests researcher Paul Nantulya.

The researcher, in a study of the Africa Center for Strategic Studies, said that East Africa, as "central node" in the Chinese strategy, will be linked by "designed and / or operating ports, pipelines, railways and power stations built and financed by Chinese companies and lenders".

The emblematic mark of the importance of the region is the already inaugurated Mombasa-Nairobi railway, as well as the electric railway line from Addis Ababa to Djibouti, where China has established its first naval base abroad and has holdings in a deepwater strategic port.

Macao Forum needs more visibility

Although efforts have been made in recent years, Xu Yingzhen told Lusa that the Forum created in 2003 still "needs to reach out to more people" to better serve the cooperation and deliver more concrete results.

The business meeting was held on July 8 and 9 in São Tomé and Príncipe - the last country to join the Macau Forum in 2017. After giving his diplomatic time to Taiwan – there is, in his opinion, an opportunity to increase the Forum. "This can be the first meeting between the cities of China and the Portuguese-speaking countries," she said.
